Currently there are openings for the Architectural Commission, Community Charitable Foundation, Design Review Commission, Planning Commission, Public Works Commission, Recreation and Parks Commission and the Traffic and Parking Commission.

The City Council recommends that individuals interested in serving first participate in the [Team Beverly Hills](#) educational program to become acquainted with City operations. When vacancies occur, announcements are made at City Council meetings, printed in the local newspapers, advertised on the Cable TV BHTV10 and posted on the website.

Applicants must be residents of the City for a minimum of two years prior to filing an application. The residency requirement does not apply to certain Architectural Commission and Human Relations Commission positions. In order to meet the residency requirement, applicants must demonstrate that they are entitled to register to vote in Beverly Hills municipal elections, but are not required to be registered voters.
